

## Dual Enrollment

### Application Procedures

Complete application forms for Hannibal-LaGrange College (HLG) and the Hannibal Career & Technical Center (HCTC). Each will require a non-refundable application fee.

You will need to have your high school send an official transcript to the HLG/HCTC Admissions Office. High school transcripts should have your cumulative grade point average, class rank, and ACT score.

You will need to have transcripts from each college you have attended sent to the HLG/HCTC Admissions Office. If you are transferring to HLG with 24 hours or more of college credits with a C average, you need not take or retake the ACT.

### FAFSA

Complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid ([www.fafsa.ed.gov](http://www.fafsa.ed.gov)) no later than April 1 to qualify for Missouri Educational Programs.

### General Education Courses

- English Composition I
- Survey of Old/New Testament

- General Psychology

### Respiratory Care Courses

- Mechanical Ventilation
- Disease Management I and II
- Advanced Assessment
- Neonatal/Pediatrics
- Management
- Seminar
- National Exam Prep<sup>1</sup>
- Clinical Practicum III and IV<sup>2</sup>
- Internship

<sup>1</sup>National Exam Preparation is held in the summer June term of each year. Kettering Seminars comes to the campus to give students a week long review for both CRT and RRT national examinations.
