Our goal is to prepare you for entry-level healthcare employment, therefore, a great deal of time is spent in clinical settings as well as the classroom.



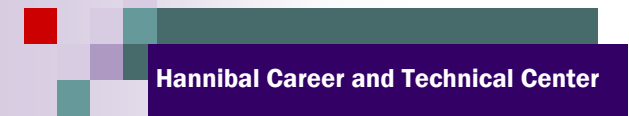

Health Services Program



In our Health Services program you will explore various areas in the healthcare workforce. Our goal is to prepare you for entry-level healthcare employment, therefore, a great deal of time is spent in clinical settings as well as the classroom.



Nursing aides work under the direction of other health care professionals, usually in nursing homes or hospitals. Their duties include taking the patient's blood pressure, temperature, and the pulse. They help patients get in and out of bed, take baths, and dress for their daily activities.

Part of their duties are to serve meals and do light housekeeping chores like making the patient's bed and general cleaning of the patient's living area.

Nursing assistants observe the patient's physical, emotional, and mental status and report any changes to the medical or nursing staff. In general the nursing assistant is the principal caregiver.

You will often have more contact with the residents than other members of the staff, therefore, it is not unusual to develop bonding relationships with the residents. It is very important that you are able to respond to them in a positive and caring manner at all times.
